Chief's Report

There is a delay of a few weeks between when I write these columns and when you read them. It always seems like when something is relevant as I write this, it is completely wrong by the time you see it. In this case, I hope that is true. Right now, the canyon is quite dry. I would love for there to be a good layer of snow by the time you see this newsletter.

With chinook winds that often come this time of year, we are a little worried about the potential for wildland fire. Please do your part to minimize fire risk by being extra cautious with things that could start a fire. This includes carefully disposing of your wood stove ashes; taking water with you when you use your chainsaw, just in case there are sparks from your equipment; and not burning slash piles unless the proper conditions exist. Check the conditions on your burn permit, but typically it is at least three inches of snow, less than 10 mph winds, daylight hours only and piles must be attended. In addition, you cannot burn stumps or large logs (greater than six inches in diameter). One other topic I wanted to cover was the new fire district sign at the bottom of the canyon. First, to alleviate any concerns from our friends and neighbors in the lower canyon—it is in the wrong place. We used to have a fire district marker, but it was knocked down and had not been in place for years. We worked with the County to get a new one installed; however, they installed it in the wrong place. We are working to get it moved to the proper place (near mile marker 7). The confusion comes from the fact that Rist Canyon and PFA response area overlaps in the lower canyon. There is an area (mostly Whale Rock) where we are jointly dispatched with PFA if there are incidents in this area. I hope that by the time you read this the sign will be in the proper place a few miles down the canyon.

Treasurer's Notes



The financial ending to 2017 for RCVFD was a great one! Why do I say that? We as a community reached a goal that was set at the beginning of 2017, to have the annual drive fund the budget! We did that and a little more. As we move forward from using the mountain festival as the major fundraiser for any budget shortfall, the annual drive becomes very important as the main catalyst for funding the fire department. Grants are being applied for and this year the fire department did receive one grant for \$10,000 to be used for upgrading needed personnel fire gear.

The RCVFD response area covers approximately 110 square miles and has somewhere around 1,200 land owners. This year we had just over 43% participating in the annual drive. That percentage is fairly good but we can do better. If we all give our support, big or little, RCVFD will be healthy and vibrant into the future. We can grow and stay a self-funded fire department and not have to see a line item on our tax notification for being a tax district. A tax district means county, state and federal regulations; and being self funded means we, as a community, can operate as we see our needs. I would much rather see an annual fund raising letter in the mail than another tax line item. All the RCVFD volunteers, especially the fire and medical personnel, thank each and every one of you for your support in 2017!

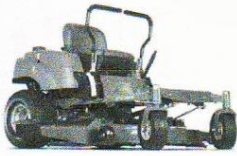
Louise Creager, Stratton Park Rep

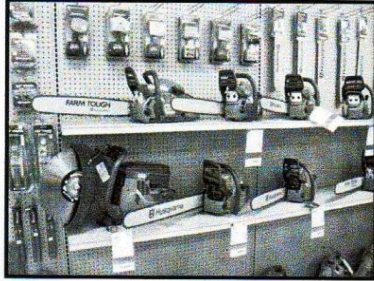
Brian Finley, Whale Rock Rep

July 22, 2017 RCVFD responded to an urgent request for mutual aid to help with the Spring Glade Wildfire. The fire was located at Coyote Ridge Nature Reserve in south Fort Collins. We were able to staff a type 6 engine as well as our type 3. Over 15 agencies were present. RCVFD was proud to be part of a strike force and fight the fire alongside our awesome partners from Glacier View VFA, Livermore VFA and Wellington FD. Our team was led by a supervisor from Larimer County Emergency Services. At the time of these photos the fire had burned approximately 360 acres. Living with Coyotes in Colorado



Perhaps no other wild animal has endured the wrath of humans while evoking such genuine heartfelt admiration quite like the coyote. Some people curse their existence; Native Americans consider them to be the smartest animal on earth, calling them "God's dog", and many urbanites revel in opportunities to see and hear these vocal predators. The coyote's success is attributed to the coyote's own ability to adapt. Coyotes have adjusted very well to human-disturbed environments, and now thrive in close proximity to people.

Coyotes are opportunistic hunters. They prey on small mammals, domestic pets, livestock, and domestic fowl but will also readily eat carrion and plants. A coyote will adjust its diet depending on the food that is available. In Colorado, coyotes are classified as a game species and may be taken year-round with either a small game or a furbearer license. Landowners may kill coyotes, without a license, on their land if the coyotes threaten their property or livestock.

Humans can coexist with coyotes. The following guidelines can help you and your family to be Coyote Wise. All Front Range communities are home to coyotes. Coyotes in populated areas are less fearful of people. They have been known to attack pets and approach people too closely.

Your Home & Coyotes:

Never Feed Coyotes!

- Remove attractants from your yard, including pet food, water sources, bird feeders and fallen fruit.
- Secure trash in a container with a locking lid or put trash out on the morning of pick up.
- Deter coyotes with a 6 foot privacy fence.
- Never approach wildlife. If a coyote approaches, yell, throw rocks or sticks at it, spray with a hose, or bang pots and pans.

If a Coyote Approaches You:

- Do not run or turn your back.
- Be as big and loud as possible.
- Wave your arms and throw objects.
- Face the coyote and back away slowly.
- If attacked, fight back.

Protect Your Pets:

- Keep pets on a short (6-foot) leash.
- Use extra caution dusk through dawn.
- Avoid known or potential den sites and thick vegetation.
- Do not allow dogs to play or interact with coyotes.
- Pick up small pets if confronted by a coyote.
- Always supervise your pet when outside, especially at dawn or dusk.
- Never leave cats or dogs outside after dark.
- Don't leave pet food outside.
- If you must leave your pet outside, secure it in a fully enclosed kennel.

Be Prepared!

If you have concerns about an encounter with a coyote:

- Recreate during daylight hours.
- Walk with a walking stick.
- Keep a deterrent spray handy.
- Carry noise makers or rocks to throw.

The Denver Post recently reported that coyotes are especially aggressive during January and February, their breeding season.¹

If you have an emergency situation involving coyotes, contact the nearest Colorado Parks and Wildlife office, Monday-Friday, during regular business hours. Outside normal business hours, contact the Colorado State Patrol or your county's sheriff's office.

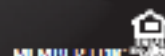



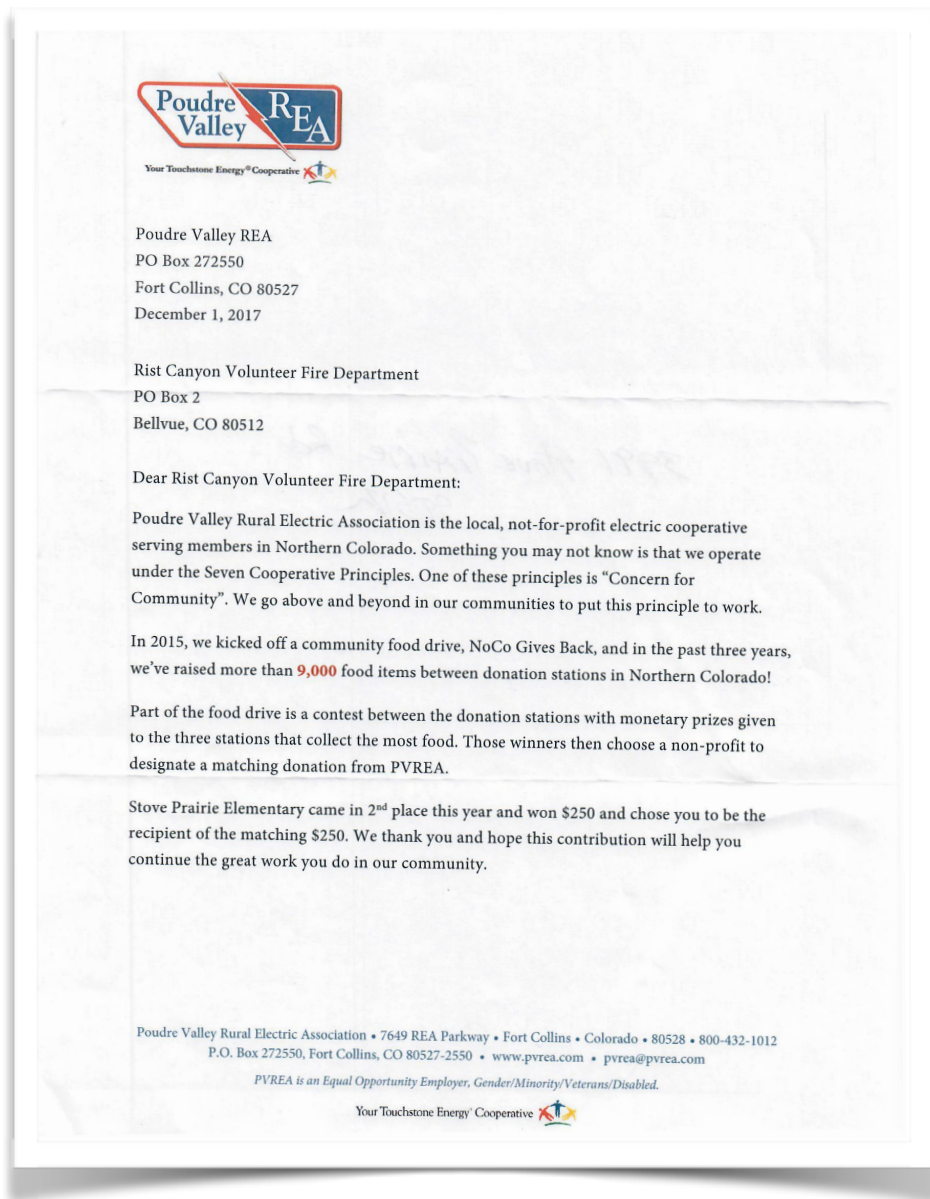
