Letter from the President

As most of all of us already know, we are in the midst of wildfire season. This being present in our minds, it is an excellent time to review all home wildfire mitigation, emergency evacuation procedures and replacement cost insurance coverage on your home.

Wildfire mitigation includes defensible space around your home and outbuildings. Material explaining the proper techniques are available through your RCVFD Area Representative.

Practice all emergency evacuation procedures with children and have a common, agreed upon meeting place away from danger. Prioritize all things that need to leave with you. Be sure to know all roadway exits from your area.

Review your homeowner's insurance coverage to make sure you are adequately covered for replacement cost of your home and contents. Purchase price or mortgage loan amounts are not always sufficient; the amount should be for replacement costs.

STATISTICS YOU MAY NOT KNOW

- A home fire is reported in the U.S. every 86 seconds.
- You have three minutes to escape a burning home
- Approximately seven people die each day in home fires.

- A fire doubles in size every minute.
- Forty-four fire fighters have died in the line of duty so far in 2018.

The statistics listed above are not intended to scare you, but to keep you informed and to keep fire safety present in your mind. As many of us who experienced the High Park Fire know, "This can happen."

We should also keep in mind the volunteers who are willing to assist everyone in our community 24/7, who give so freely of their time and ask nothing in return.

Please put the RCVFD Festival on your calendar for September 8th, the Saturday <u>after</u> Labor Day; NOT the Labor Day weekend, as in the past.

RCVFD is one of only three donation-based volunteer fire departments in the State of Colorado. Therefore your annual donation is extremely important to the support and safety of the first Responders.

Let's all do what we can to help keep RCVFD a NON-TAX BASED department. If you are in need RCVFD will be there.

Chief's Report

As I write this, it is cloudy and rainy outside —a welcome break from the dry, hot days we had in early June. The fire danger has plummeted for a while, so we can all breathe a little easier. It has been tough watching all the fires around us, particularly the Badger Creek fire and the other large fires near Durango. Many of us recall the long days of June 2012 when the weather would not give us any relief from the High Park fire. Our thoughts are with the people in those communities going through those same struggles. It is important to remember that I write this a few weeks ahead of when you read it. By the time you see this, the weather may have returned to a hot, dry pattern. If so, remain very cautious about any potential ignition source. For example, a few years ago we had a contractor mowing weeds on our Foothills Campus here at CSU. They started a grass fire by hitting a rock that created a spark—in the end several acres of grass burned.

RCVFD responders have been training hard, as we do every spring. To prepare for wildland fire season we do an all-day refresher and take a "pack test" to demonstrate our fitness. This is all on top of regular trainings. In addition, several responders have
