2024 RCVFD Mountain Festival a Big Success!

The annual RCVFD Mountain Festival was held on Saturday, September 7, 2024, to raise funds for the Rist Canyon Volunteer Fire Department. It was a fun day and an excellent Festival. We are still calculating the profit for RCVFD because there are some

expenses to come in and some Silent Auction purchasers need to pick up and pay for their items. We plan to announce the final amount of profit at the RCVFD annual community potluck lunch meeting at 1pm on Saturday, November 2, 2024, at Stove Prairie RANCH. Based on the information we have now, I am estimating we made over \$30,000 profit for the fire department!

There were about 3,200 happy attendees. Over 135 neighbor volunteers worked together to make the Festival happen; they are listed in this newsletter. This event brought neighbors together to renew old friendships, build new friendships, inform people about the activities of RCVFD, and raise money for our fire department.

This year's Festival featured a huge used book sale with over 20,000 books; a wonderful silent auction with over 300 items; a delicious bake sale with about 75 pies plus over 1,000 smaller items (e.g., cookies, brownies, muffins); a plant sale with over 200 plants; a great RCVFD Festival T-shirt sale, where we sold over 200 T-shirts, hoodies, and tanks with this

year's logo, plus about 40 vintage shirts from past years; 47 booths with craft sellers and other vendors; over 20 non-profit educational booths; outstanding live musical entertainment by four local bands; an old-fashioned dunk tank; firefighter demonstrations of equipment; a display of our fire trucks; free ice cream in a variety of flavors; food trucks; and a kids' area with lots of different activities, games, and farm animals. In addition, we had over 35 generous groups supporting the Festival as sponsors! Winter Bird Watching in Rist Canyon

Winter birdwatching in Rist Canyon brings joy even in the coldest months. Some charismatic species like chickadees, juncos, and woodpeckers stay year-round, while others like mountain chickadees, common ravens, house finches, and Northern flickers can keep the winter doldrums at bay. Spotting more elusive birds like the great-horned owl or red crossbill adds excitement, and colorful species like the Steller's jay and mountain bluebird brighten snowy landscapes. Trails, streams, and open fields offer varied birdwatching opportunities without leaves blocking the view—just remember to maintain distance for the birds' safety. A backyard feeder stocked with sunflower seeds or suet attracts many winter birds, while a heated bird bath may bring in robins. You can even make your own suet using a recipe on the National Audubon Society's website: <https://www.audubon.org/news/make-your-own-suet>. For more help, the Poudre River Public Libraries lend kits, and apps like Merlin Bird ID guide identification. Consider joining the Fort Collins Audubon Society (fortcollinsaudubon.org) for birdwatching activities.
